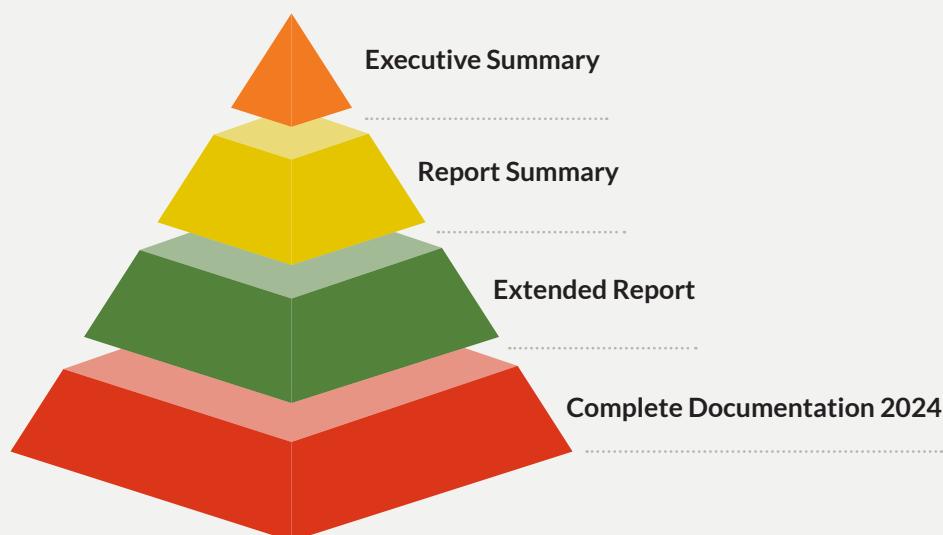
Report Structure
